What should I do if my child is unwell? – If your child is unwell, please call the Year 11 Office on 01553 779408 or email classof2025@springwoodhighschool.co.uk before 8.00am and give the specific reasons and symptoms of the illness. You will need to contact the office EVERY DAY that your child is off. The information you give will be recorded on our official register.

Leave of Absence – There may be exceptional circumstances where you need to request a leave of absence for your child. You will need to submit a "Leave of Absence Form." These can be found on the school website or we have a paper copy in the office. This form needs handing into the Year 11 office. You will then receive a phone call, email or MCAS message stating if your request has been granted or denied.

Attendance

School attendance continues to remain above national averages so far this year, despite us being hit by illnesses this half term, which is great news. Data shows year on year, that students who have good attendance do very well academically and socially.

It is important that if your child is not able to attend school that day that you phone the relevant year office, or email them, directly. Please do not wait for the alert to go out from the school. It is also important that if your child is ill for a couple of days that you continue to contact the school on a daily basis - we need to know how they are, and if the illness/symptoms change, as we occasionally need to make others within the school community aware.

If we do not see your child for a period of time then we are required, for safeguarding reasons, to make a home visit. Please can you ensure that you respond to the home visit when these are made. We cannot give you a time, and so if you are not in we will leave instructions to contact us, which you need to do when you see the card. If we have no answer after a couple of visits we then will ask someone external from the school to make that visit on our behalf. These visits are a requirement that all schools must undertake for students that they have not seen for a little while.

Whilst we understand children may have periods of genuine illness, we wish to share updated guidance from the NHS, which aims to reset expectations to pre-pandemic levels. It recognises that it has been a long time since these guidelines were shared, with mindsets which have understandably altered. With the increase in working from home, there is not necessarily the 'work pressure' to send children to school with minor ailments as it is more common to have adults in the home. The updated NHS guidance for the vast majority of illness and anxiety states that, unless your child has a significantly elevated temperature, they should be in school. 




July Rewards Day

Year 11 representing Young People and the importance of of Mental Health Care



In October, I was invited to talk at the Healthcare Finance Management Associations annual Mental health conference. In attendance were some of the finance directors of large NHS trusts, the trustees from the association, representatives from places such as the policy centre for mental health and the integrated care boards and lots of the chief executives team from HMFA were also present on the day.

My presentation was talking about the children and young people's charter, which was developed by the Youth In Mind governance group, with feedback from lots of young people. I helped to finalise the charter back in 2022. I spoke about each aspect of the charter in detail and explained why it is important for it to be adopted in mental health services, and how the majority of children and young people's services within Norfolk had already adopted the charter and the difference it had made. I then had the opportunity to be part of the Question and answer session for the entire presenters panel for that session, and received questions from the audience about how it could be best adopted by services they fund. After my presentation and the Q+A, I was fortunate enough to be in the audience for a talk from Alexandra Adams, the UKs first person who is deafblind training to be a doctor. Her talk was so inspiring and it was very interesting to hear about her experiences and how she has overcome the challenges she has faced.

Overall, it was a great experience, and I am very grateful for the chance to speak to these key people, as it is how changes happen. They are always fantastic days, and a good chance to meet people and discuss how they are going to help services improve.

In the month of May 2023, I attended the Mayor's making ceremony where I was given the role of Major's cadet for 2023-2024. This role was given to me for my hard work at the 'bag it, bank it' charity event in January 2023 where I collected 45 bags of clothes. Early on this year, I was given the opportunity to organise an event for a charity of my choice, which was the Norfolk and Waveney Mind mental health charity, where we rolled out 999 hoses in order to raise money. In total we raised £775.50 for the charity. In October I received a letter from the Chief of the Norfolk
