Attendance Update - July 2024

Once again thank you for your support with attendance this year. Springwood has remained over 1% above the national average with our attendance, across the school. You will be aware from the press that there are significant changes to school attendance that will become statutory for schools from 19th August 2024.

Some of the changes will be:

- Live attendance data is shared directly with the DoE
- Attendance codes that appear on registers will change
 - Restrictions on granting leave of absence
- There will be a national framework for Fixed Penalty Notices

For leave of absence there are now only a few possible options for this to be granted - schools can grant exceptional circumstances, but the DfE does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance. Likewise, all schools are expected to restrict leaves of absence to the specific circumstances set out in regulation 11 of the School Attendance (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2024. Please can you also be honest with the school. If we don't see a child for a number of consecutive days we are required to complete a home visit - it wastes a lot of staff time when we do home visits only to then find that the family has gone on holiday.

Please continue to contact the school if your child is ill, or if they have a medical appointment. Contact should be made to the relevant year office prior to the start of school. Where possible, please make medical appointments later in the day. As ever, please continue to contact the year office or attendance team if you have any concerns regarding your child's attendance. We will communicate all of the changes in more detail in an attendance specific communication at the start of next term.



My Child At School



On September 1st we will no longer be using SIMS as our management information system, and will instead move to BROMCOM. One of the advantages of this for parents is that you will have access to the MCAS app (My Child At School). This is an APP that you can download to you phone via the relevant app stores, or access online at <https://www.mychildatschool.com/MCAS/MCSParentLogin>

We will be publishing communications to MCAS and you will be able to access information about your child at school. However, you will also be able to check and update your data collection form as soon as your details (address, phone number etc) changes. It can also be used to enrol your child into school clubs, book parents' evening appointments, check homework, and in the future will also be used for dinner money and other online transactions (we will inform you when this change occurs). This should be the only app you then require to access everything about your child at Springwood.

You will initially receive an activation code along with instructions on how to access your account. This will be sent to the email address we currently have on file for you on 1st September - you will need to activate the account within a couple of days of this being sent.

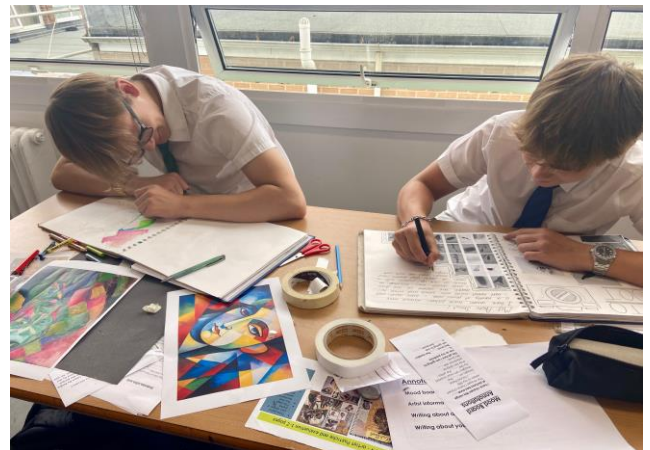

Super Learning Day

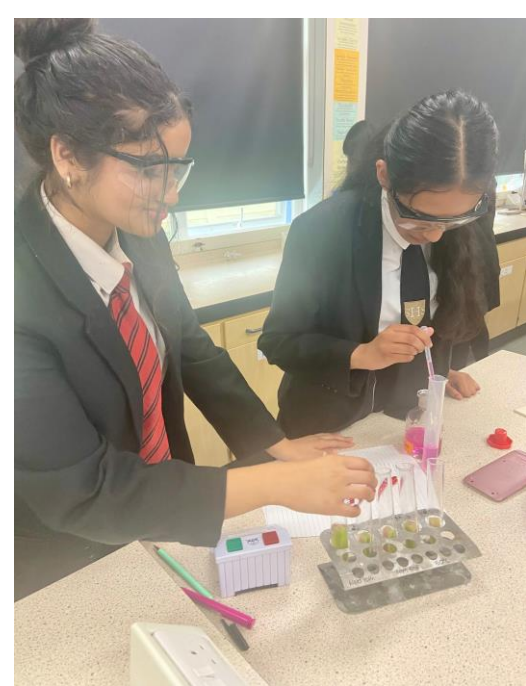

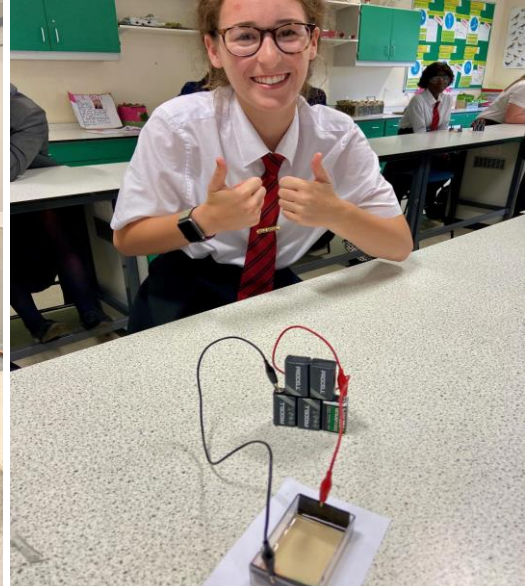
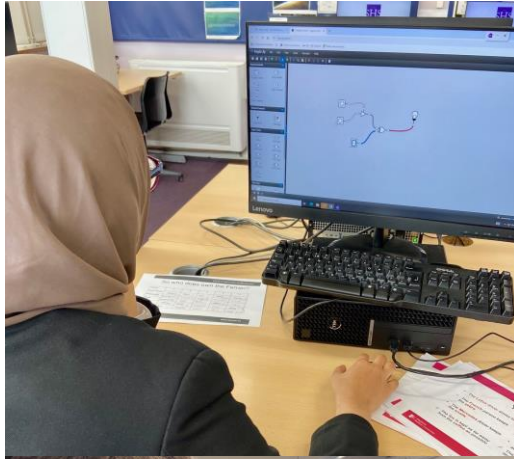
College and 6th Form Taster Day

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Work Experience and Careers Opportunities

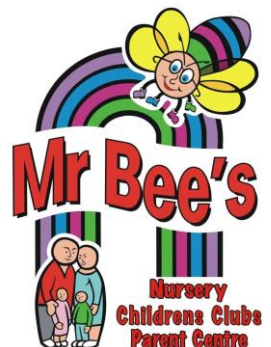
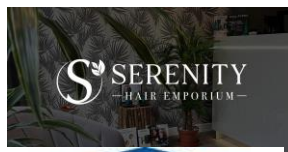
We are delighted to have offered students a wide range of career experiences this half term. Carrying on from those which have taken place of the course of the year.

We finish Year 10 with 31.8% of the cohort having had 1 to 1 a careers interview with our external careers adviser. By the end of Year 11 this will have risen to 100%.

72.4% of the cohort have also had the opportunity of a small group careers interaction, workshop or talk in an area they have expressed interest in or linked to their curriculum study. And as we return from Covid and start to rebuild our work experience and good number have enjoyed a work placement or been off site partaking in subject-linked camps or placements.

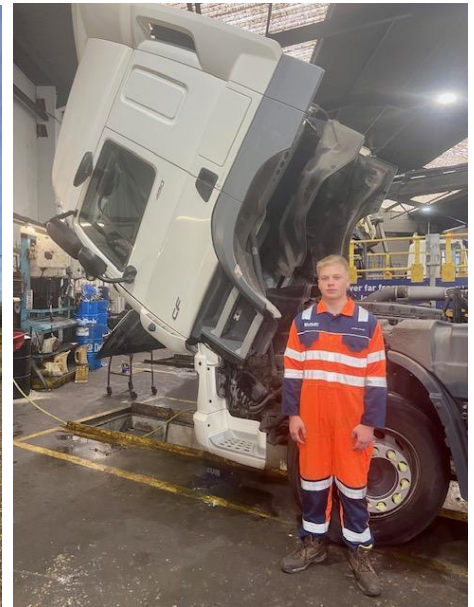
This section highlights some of those experiences.

Work Experience



Here are a few images showing what some of our students got up to while out on work experience. Roles included working in hospitality, Engineering DAF lorries, laying decking, learning wiring and electrical skills and working in local primary schools. And this was just a start. Benas showed particular skill while at the Corn exchange, lighting up the stage for a public performance. Our hope is that via work experience students will gain an insight into the working world and have a goal to work towards over the coming year.



Career sessions

This half term has also seen a number of in school opportunities. Students have taken part in Law themed days, Journalism workshops and talks with a local primary school teacher.

We look forward to exploring more sectors with students in the near future.



Students taking part in a Law day were given the chance to speak to a range of law professionals. Hear about working in the sector and make decisions about what they would do should they be working on a legal case.

A massive well done to all students who participated in the COWA healthcare's career visit this half term. Students explored the state of the air resources available to those studying the likes of the nursing T-level, learnt about CPR, talked about all the roles available within the NHS and finished the visit with a bed making competition. COWA staff were hugely complementary of those who took part.

the salters' institute chemistry events



Salters Chemistry Festival

On 23rd May, 10 students were given the opportunity to visit UEA to attend a chemistry festival organised by the Salters' Institute.

Upon arrival, we were given a polite welcome and went straight into meeting with Dr Rianne M. Lord, who works as a Director of Admission. Dr M. Lord explained how she uses chemistry in her job, to find a cure for cancer. We then began the practical aspect of the day, which was creating aspirin. In pairs, we used many different techniques to get a purified product of aspirin. After creating the drug, we then used an IR Spectrum to see the different bonds in the molecules. At the end of the day, we had a career talk with four chemists, who explained their roles within the institute and how they got to where they are today. Overall, it was a great experience and we all learnt a lot!

John Innes Science Camp



During my week in the John Innes Centre, I learned about what it is actually like to be a scientist. We worked in a professional environment with professional equipment and techniques. It was very interesting as I learnt about many new topics in Biology such as Electrophoresis and PCR. Furthermore, I also spent a day in the insectary with the entomology department where I explored a new world of possibilities that insects provide. Insects are a massive problem for farmers; the insectary in the JIC helps to find plants that are more resistant to dangerous insects. These insects are kept in a highly quarantined area since they could seriously damage the ecosystem if they escape. Overall, I had a great experience in the JIC and the skills I acquired will surely help me in the future!

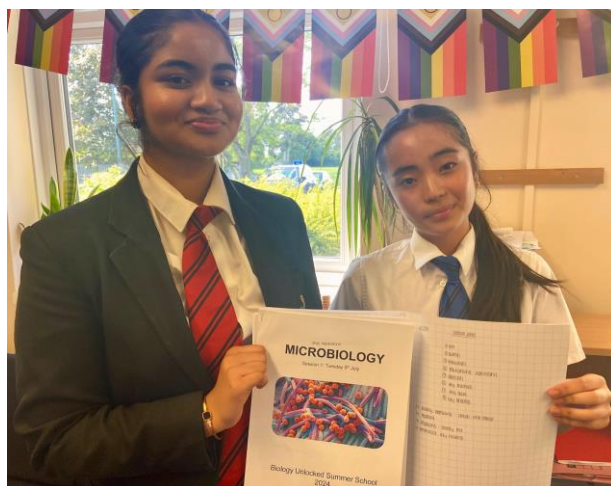
To reflect on my involvement in this inspiring programme, I would highly recommend for students to take part in such possible activities in the future.

Geography - Fieldwork Trip

A student summary of what our Geographers have been up to recently. On the 11th of July, students who studied coastal processes in their geography classes had the chance to go to Hunstanton to apply their geographical studies to the real world, and to gather data on the different hypotheses they have been given, based on what they have been learning. On the day, the weather was not ideal, but after a bit of complaining, the 'researchers' managed to crack down on their field work and bring in note-worthy results, through gathering visual information or going down to the sandy beaches and personally evaluating different criteria.





They examined things such as how effective groynes are at building up beaches by stopping longshore drift, or how the height of a beach changes as you go up and down its width. The students were given a lot of freedom and independence during this field work, and by being put in randomly selected groups, they had the opportunity to work on a lot of valuable skills while gathering data amongst themselves. Overall, this trip was a chance for students to consolidate their knowledge about coastal processes that they already have received in their classroom and to see how words or drawings in their books look like in the real world, and on the whole the students have enjoyed themselves personally gathering data, like real geographers would.

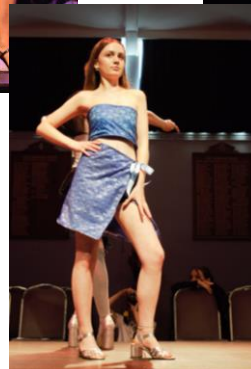


Fashion Show

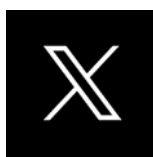

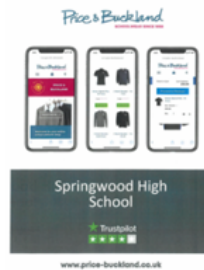
